It was Hari Raya mood during the whole month of October 2008. I am sure we all received many open houses invitations.

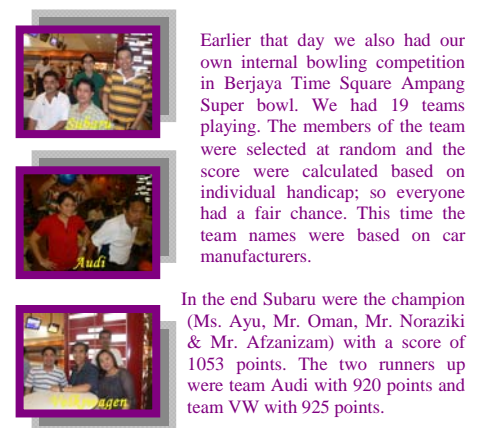
We are very thankful and fortunate to attend Hari Raya Open House organized by Petronas Gas Berhad and also Aromatics Malaysia Sdn Bhd.
